The 3k annual sponsorship grant for voting members allows you to participate in any Vaughan sporting and recreation event with no volunteer hours required. Reimbursement will be up to a maximum of \$3,000 per year for voting members and \$1,000 a year for associate members; this includes fees paid to your approved attendant. See the description of these two grants in this issue. The Chapter will reimburse .50¢ per mile round trip for attending the bimonthly membership meetings, and if you have a caregiver, they will get a \$65 stipend and must be with you during the membership meeting. Vaughan Chapter's goal this year is to reach out to every member in the surrounding areas; for this to happen, we will conduct membership meetings near you so you can attend. 

Multiple Sclerosis & PVA Assistance with VA Claims

According to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, "Multiple sclerosis (MS) involves an immune-mediated process in which an abnormal response of the body's immune system is directed against the central nervous system (CNS). The CNS is made up of the brain, spinal cord, and optic nerves. MS deteriorates your nerves. From there the damages leave behind scar tissue which is how the disease is given its name; multiple sclerosis, or "multiple areas of scarring.".

Paralyzed Veterans of America National Service Officers assist our veterans with development of complex claim related to MS. There are multiple reasons claims for VA benefits for MS may be denied. The most common being:



- Inability to prove service-connection. If you have filed outside of the 7-year window for presumptive service-connection, it may be difficult to prove.
- Difficulty with a diagnosis. Because MS can be so difficult to diagnose, the VA may require more evidence than usual to verify your MS.
- Symptoms Aren't Serious Enough. MS is a degenerative disease meaning that it progressively
 gets worse over time. At first, the symptoms of MS can be fairly mild which means that the VA
 may determine you are not in need of benefits.

Because of the unique nature of those living with MS, there can be a higher degree of difficulty in putting together a foolproof VA claim. Be sure to be comprehensive as you file, in order to have the best chance of getting the full benefits you deserve as a veteran.

Write a letter to tell your story to the VA. Your medical records and the claim form document give specific information like name or diagnosis code – a personal letter can share how your condition or disability has affected your life – it's what we call 'the rest of the story'.

Lay statements for family, friends, and other veterans. If they have first-hand knowledge through observation, your friends and family can also contribute a statement with details about the injury, event, or disease and how it has affected your activities, relationships, etc.

A Veteran Service Officer (VSO) can be your advocate throughout the VA claims process. VSOs can be a sounding board and a second set of eyes. A VSO can review service treatment records, lay information, and ask relevant questions. NSO's are knowledgeable about eligibility, regulations, forms completion, required and recommended "proof documents"; telling your story in the most complete and efficient way in the strongest claim packet that can be submitted.


If you are a veteran and denied this type of claim, please contact PVA National Service Officer for further assistance.

From The Treasurers Desk:

I want to take this opportunity to give a shout out to the Vaughan chapter finance committee, a group of volunteers managing the chapters cash and cash equivalent which includes our portfolio. The volunteer members of the finance committee are Anthony Powell, Winston Woodard |||, Leo Moore, Daniel James, and Robert Arciola.

The finance committee meets the 1st Friday of each month to manage the chapter's portfolio and the cash flow for annual operating expenditures. This team of chapter members have consistently made good trades during the market's period of volatility. Allowing the chapter to maintain a return on investment of approximately 5% since inception.

Therefore, as chair of the chapters finance committee thank you gentlemen for the work you are doing.

Supporting the chapter's FY24 budget as follows:

· Chapter Grant Revenue PVA	\$150,656
· Donations and Service Revenue	\$144,500
· Advocacy and Legislation Grant	\$ 2,000
· Newsletter Advertisement Revenue	\$ 1,000
· Membership Dues	\$ 300
· Corporate Solicitation	\$ 12,000
· Sports and Recreation Revenue	\$ 74,000
· Dividend and Interest Revenue	\$ 65,000
· Transferred in from Portfolio Revenue	\$ 203,014
· Total Budgeted Income	\$ 652,470

As illustrated \$65,000+ \$203,014 equals \$268,014 represents the portfolio's contribution to FY 24 budget revenue.

- 1. Lifetime enjoyment fund \$200 per fiscal year: Go to a Movie, take the wife to dinner or a football game, submit your receipts, and the chapter will reimburse you up to \$200:
- 2. Attend an event sponsored by a PVA chapter anywhere in the United States of America and be reimbursed up to \$3000 for the cost of you and your attendance if necessary. Funding is approved based on pre-event submitted requests.
- **3.** Finally, if you need to solve some dilemma affecting you or your immediate family, contact one of our service officers. The Vaughan chapter's Governing Body has discretionary funds available to help members in times of need.



PVA VETERANS CAREER PROGRAM UPDATE

December 2023

OPTIONS FOR RETRAINING



Rose Lopez is an Army veteran. She contacted the Veterans Career Program after a Veterans Career Live session on Federal hiring procedures. Her degrees and experience were in IT, but she didn't know if that was the field she wanted to be in as a career. Rose and Jim Arndt, our counselor in Minneapolis,

MN, began exploring alternative careers while continuing to consider IT positions.

Rose continued to participate in our weekly career webinars; and one session that turned her career outlook around was with the Accelerated Training in Defense Manufacturing (ATDM). ATDM is a Department of Defense program designed to quickly train qualified candidates in essential manufacturing skills and trades to establish a steady and sustainable flow of qualified workers for the naval shipbuilding and repair sector of the submarine industrial base (https://atdm.org/). Rose applied for and was accepted into the program in late 2023. She will relocate to Virginia for training, and will be assisted with finding a career after the program is completed.

From Rose: "Paralyzed Veterans of America (PVA) has profoundly impacted my life. Their exceptional vocational rehabilitation counseling and unwavering commitment to empowering disabled veterans is unparalleled. Thanks to their support and dedication, I discovered the Accelerated Training in Defense Manufacturing (ATDM) program, paving my way toward a fulfilling career as a CNC machinist in defense manufacturing. I am deeply grateful for PVA and ATDM's support, confident that their guidance will help me achieve my goals and make a meaningful impact in the industry."

2023 ACHIEVEMENTS & IMPACT

It was another busy year for the Veterans Career Program staff as we assisted transitioning service members, veterans of all eras, their families and caregivers with finding meaningful careers.

In 2023, the Veterans Career Program placed 223 clients: 209 veterans, 14 family members, and 4 caregivers. The average salary for clients in full-time employment was \$71,062 (40% higher than the national average for veteran employment).

Our counselors maintained an active client list of 550+ veterans, military family members and caregivers; including 360 new clients.

Also in 2023, we held 88 Veterans Career Lives sessions covering Career Skills (43), Employer Sessions (20), Education (11), Small Business (10), Health & Wellness (3) and Financial Planning (1).

And lastly, we launched our Disabled Veterans Self-Employment program with the goal of offering training and counseling to PVA members and spouses interested in self-employment/small business start-up. We hosted two 10-week sessions for 30 PVA members and spouses (111 applications). We awarded \$10,000 in start-up grants (thanks to the Wells Fargo Foundation) to four participants as part of "Pitch Night" competitions.


