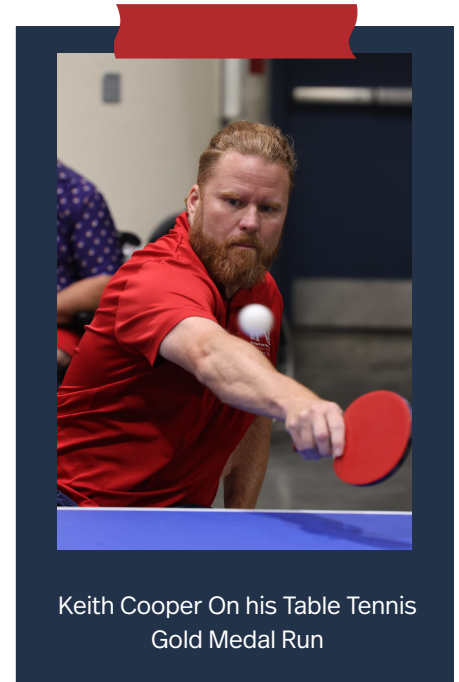

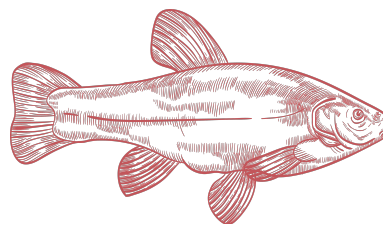

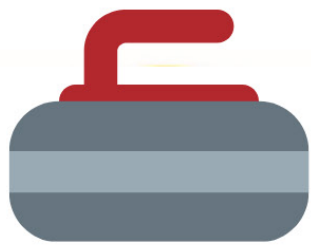

Avoiding a Break in Your TSA PreCheck: After Retirement

Now that you're retired, you're hoping to have more time to travel with your family for some real R&R. You booked your flight and packed your bags. Still, when you check in before departure, you notice you don't have a Transportation Security Administration (TSA) PreCheck indicator on your boarding pass. You're sure you entered your standard access card (CAC) ID in the Know Travel Number (KTN) field for all your airline profiles, so this would happen. What gives? When you call the airline, they can't seem to get your Department of Defense (DoD) ID to take. You note that you have recently retired from duty and discovered your DoD ID is no longer valid for TSA PreCheck.



TSA PreCheck is a risk-based system allowing expedited screening for trusted travelers. When a civilian enrolls and is approved for the program, they receive a KTN. The whole application process involves a security threat assessment based on a background check. So, for years as a uniformed service member, you received TSA PreCheck through your continued military service and background checks conducted by the DoD. Upon separation/retirement from service, the DoD background check is no longer valid; therefore, your DoD ID can no longer be used as your KTN, regardless of if you have one on your retirement ID.

To avoid any break in your TSA PreCheck benefits, we encourage service members to apply for TSA PreCheck at tsa.gov/precheck (or another department of Homeland Security Trusted Traveler Program) at ttp.cbp.dhs.gov before retiring or transitioning out of service. The process starts with a brief online application from one of our enrollment providers. Next, you visit one of over 650 convenient enrollment locations listed here:

<https://www.tsa.gov/precheck/enrollment-centers> (searchable by zip code) and complete your enrollment by scanning your fingerprints, showing proof of citizenship, and uploading a photo. Most applicants are approved within 3-5 business days, and once enrolled, you will receive a KTN that is good for five years. The TSA PreCheck program also partners with credit cards and loyalty programs to offer application reimbursement. Win-win!

What about Family?

Just as when you were in service, your spouse, travel companions, and family members over 18 must enroll individually. Children 12 and under can always accompany you in the TSA PreCheck line for free, as well as children 13-17 when on the same reservation and the PreCheck indicator appears on their boarding pass.

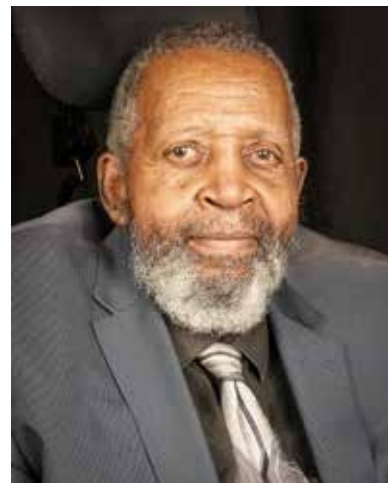

This above list was not meant to be all-inclusive; it was just a friendly reminder of some happenings in FY 25.

I'm also reminding you that in your chapter of PVA, we'll cover the cost of airfare, hotel accommodations, mileage reimbursement, and a stipend for your caregiver. Here's how it works: Take a hypothetical member who lives 200 miles round trip from Hines Hospital. This member attends a quarterly membership meeting. The chapter will pay him or her the following:

1. \$0.50 a mile times 200 miles, equaling \$100:
2. his caregiver, a family member, and a friend. Making it possible for him to be in attendance would receive a stipend of \$65:

That same member attending the national wheelchair games would include a national-sponsored PVA event or any chapter-sponsored PVA event that Happens over multiple days. The chapter will pay for the following. Travel to the airport \$0.50 a mile.

The cost of airfare, the cost of hotel accommodation A caregiver stipend equal to \$135 per day A daily per diem or, in some cases, reimbursement for meals while attending that event. Let me close by saying these members should update their personal information, including mailing addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses. This helps staff mail out checks for birthdays and, this year, \$100 in place of a Veteran's Day dinner. To qualify, just call the office to update your information and request either your birthday check or your Veteran's Day gift. So, as a member, be sure to take advantage of the financial programs the chapter has in place to make your participation easier.

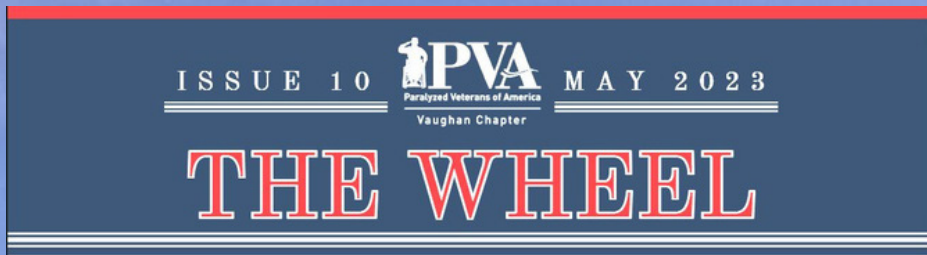

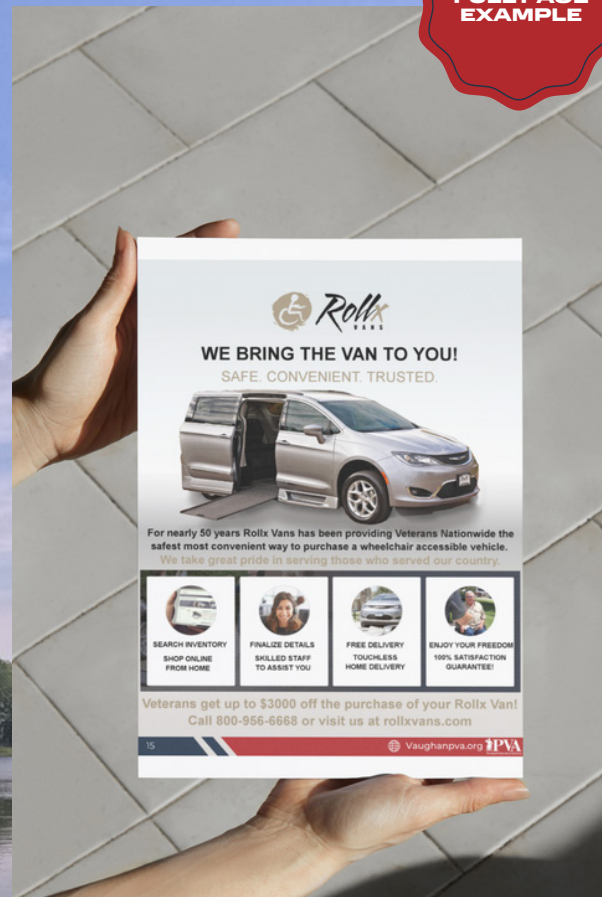

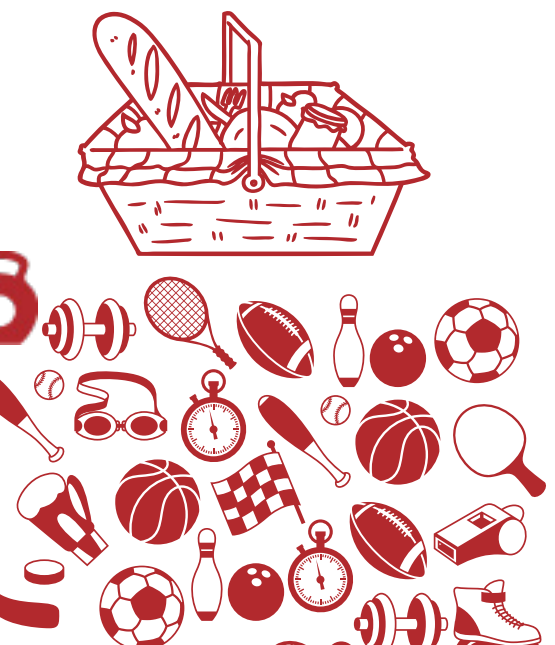

PERSISTENCE PERSONIFIED



Andrea Ruiz's story can best be described as persistence personified. Andrea is a retired Army veteran, who joined the military in 2012 wanting to see the world. Her plan to pursue a life-long career in the military was cut

short after being diagnosed with Chiari malformation with an inoperable syrinx on her spine in 2017.

Andrea initially reached out to VCP vocational counselors looking for basic resources and peer support. Over time however, Andrea was able to get assistance in many different areas that can affect an individual's quality of life. For example, accessible home design, academic accommodations, and help finding a remote position.

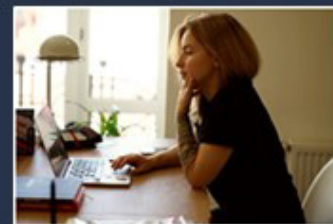
Since becoming a client of the Veterans Career Program in April 2022, Andrea has made use of every opportunity presented to her. In November 2023, she obtained a full-time position as a peer support specialist. Andrea has also started her own business, Sowing Soothing Seeds, with the help of the VCP self-employment program. Her business allows her to utilize her experiences with chronic pain and mental health to help others.

Recently, Andrea was offered a fellowship with RespectAbility's National Leadership Program. This program aims to train leaders who are committed to disability issues and plan to go into careers in public policy, advocacy, communications, diversity, equity and inclusion, fundraising, nonprofit management or faith-based inclusion.

DOG TAG FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM



The Dog Tag Fellowship Program equips veterans, military spouses, and caregivers with the tools and education to build resilience, find renewed purpose, and forge community beyond the military. Dog Tag provides a bridge from military service to the civilian world and acts as a catalyst for finding direction and moving forward. Fellows earn a business certificate from Georgetown University (DC program) or Loyola University Chicago (Chicago program); bring their coursework to life by learning the ins and outs of running a successful business in the bakery; build community with each other; and enhance their well-being by committing time to introspection, storytelling, and personal growth.

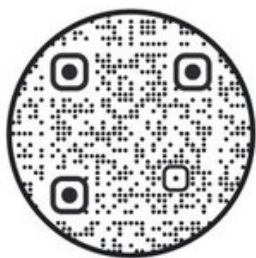

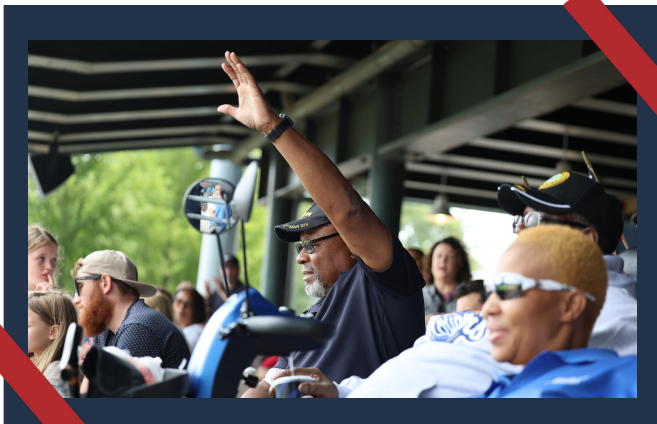

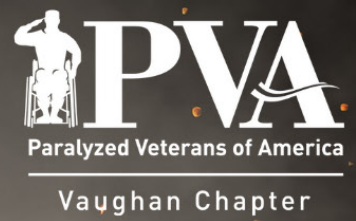
